The day has finally arrived. After over eight years of dedication by hundreds of volunteers across the country, and significant investment from Human Resources Development Canada, we now have a national standard for the Certified Human Resource Professional (CHRP) designation.

Effective March 1, 2003, all new CHRPs are granted through individual

assessments only. The following chart describes the new process to obtain and maintain your CHRP.

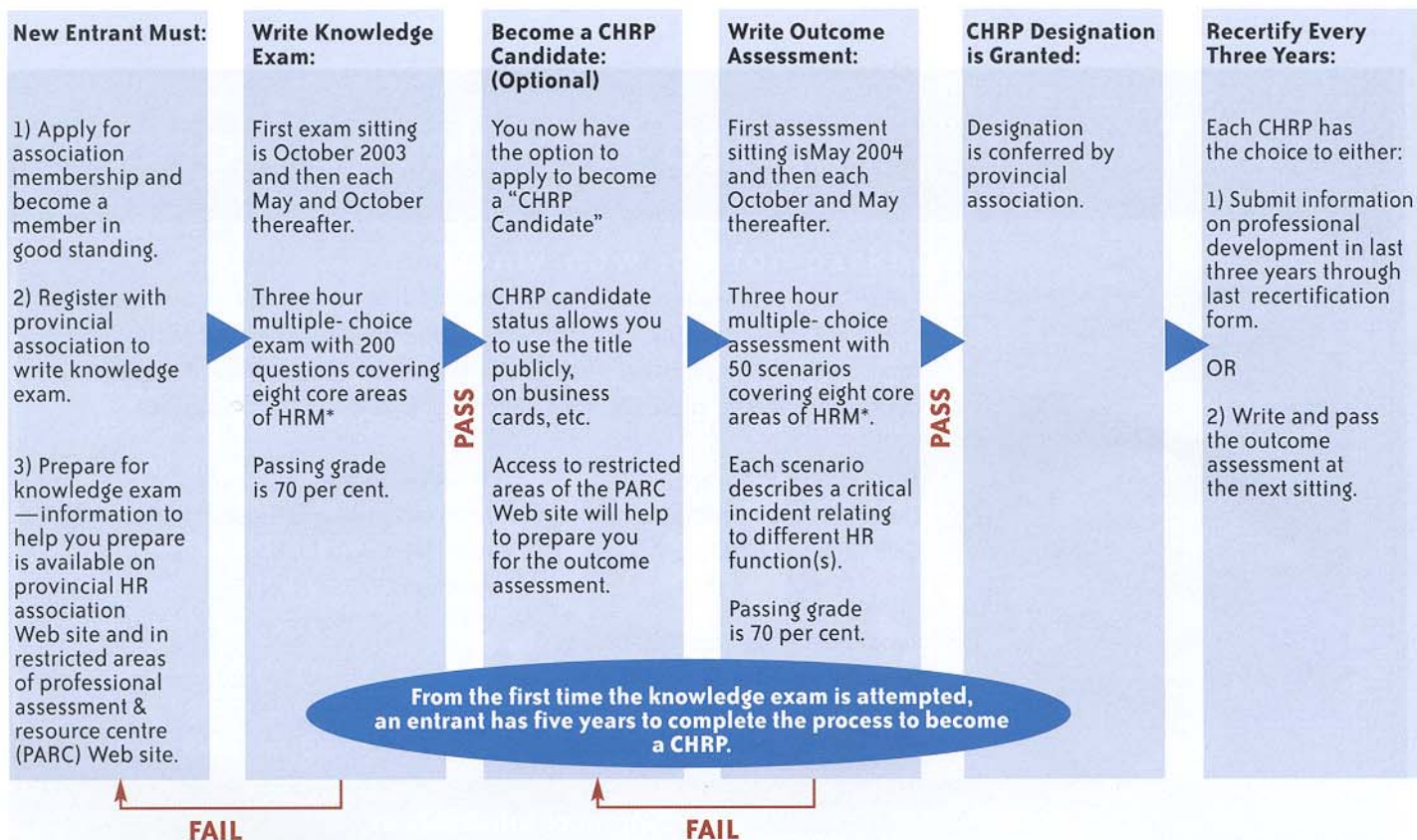
